SKIPPER RESPONSIBILITIES

It is the duty of each Santa Barbara Sea Shell Association skipper to:

- 1. Display good sportsmanship to others, whether as a winner or loser.
- 2. Learn the basic rules of sailing (including the SBSSA Racing Rules and Procedures) in order to become a better sailor
- 3. Wear a life jacket at all times when on the water (and possibly a wetsuit to avoid getting cold).
- 4. Have your boat rigged, at the beach, and ready to start promptly at 1:00 PM unless otherwise notified, and have a parent or guardian on the beach to assist.
- 5. Register with the Race Secretary for each day of racing.
- 6. For US Sabot, have your boat equipped with a bailer, a USCG approved personal flotation device with whistle attached, a paddle, an anchor and anchor line sufficient to secure your boat and a painter or tow line at least 15 feet in length.
- 7. Actively participate in the SBSSA sailing program and attend the "Hut Meetings" and instructional sessions
- 8. Train or assist novice sailors as a condition of being assigned to the RS Tera or RS Feva fleets.
- 9. Aid and promote the objectives of SBSSA by explaining them to your friends and family and encouraging new members to join.
